# V. Funding Requests

- a) QFS 1 st grade field trip to Flanders Nature Center to learn about life cycles, animal habitats, and plants as pollinators. The total request for this trip is \$1,572 \$12 per student.
- b) QFS 1 st grade in school field trip. Critter Caravan would come to QFS to give the students a hands-on experience with different animals. The total request for this experience is \$1,000.

i) GOES – 5 th grade field trip to Sturbridge Village. The students will get to sexperience colonial life. This trip will support their social studies content. The total request for this trip is \$2,584.

QFS currently has \$190.50 in allocated funds which makes their request the higher value @ \$2,381.95. If the requests are passed \$2,381.95 needs to allocated to all 3 schools.

Motion to approve funding all three requests – Melissa motioned; Isabella seconded; motion PASSED

- ii) OMS Grad Signs We preordered 100 signs and our final bill is \$659.00. If we lower the price from \$17 to \$12 this year to break even, we need to sell 55 signs. The last 2 years we sold about 75 signs.
  - We need to agree on the new price this year and figure out the logistics for the parents to pickup their signs. We also need Kate to set up a payment link on our website. Motion to price the signs at \$12 Linda; seconded Isabella; motioned PASSED
- iii) GOES adjustment We needed to write out a check for \$200 to GOES for the 5 th grade field trip to Wolfe Park for the added non-resident fee for the pavilion. Their allocated funds were reduced from \$742.75 to \$542.75.
- iv) GOES adjustment The 4th-grade field trip to the Audubon Center was canceled by the venue. They were able to reschedule a new field trip to Flanders Nature Center. An additional \$150 is needed for this trip. Their allocated funds were reduced from \$542.75 to \$392.75 and a check will be written for the additional funds needed.


## XI. Addendum
